ALUMNUS SEES NEED FOR MORE MEN TO EXPERIENCE PHI PSI LIFE

ALUMNUS SPOTLIGHT—David Ekland '76

hen I was applying to different colleges during my senior year in high school, my father told me I might want to visit some of them prior to making a decision. I made my first college visit to the Alabama campus in the spring of 1976. It was the only college visit I made. I loved Tuscaloosa.

Being from Iowa, people asked me why I was looking at schools so far away from home. My only reply was that I had to get out of the cold and snow. I showed up in Tuscaloosa and it proceeded to snow six inches that winter.

I remember becoming an active at Alabama Alpha on Halloween 1976. We were the first pledge class to go through an eightweek pledge program. I don't think I was what you would call an ideal pledge, but it was a great experience for me. I was a Yankee going to school in the Deep South. The culture and people were totally different than what I had ever been exposed to.

The Phi Psi experience I had during my two years at Alabama is something I would not trade for anything. It was a time in my life that I look back with fond memories. I know it was the first time I wore a tie to a football game when it was 90 degrees. I remember the actives taking us to Birmingham to get "our wings," learning to play shuffleboard, and seeing the Chapter president on the roof of the house watching a tornado go by. I owe many a thank-you to the people who took this stranger into their lives. I especially owe gratitude to my pledge dad, David Gunter '75, and his wife, Jayne. You sometimes don't realize until later in life what fun you had, what knowledge you gathered, and the institutions you cherish.

I was asked by Brother **Tryon Hubbard '64** why someone so far away still gives to this Phi Psi Chapter. It is a simple answer. I hope this Chapter is around long enough so that more men have the opportunity to be a



part of the Phi Psi house at the University of Alabama. It is the first time in your life you learn to live with and become friends with individuals you may not have searched out in high school or college.

David and his wife of 26 years, Julie, are both graduates of the University of Iowa. They have been very active in the American Cancer Society and are founding members of the New Directions group of ACS that has raised more than \$2 million for local cancer research since its inception in 1994. David has been a member of the Hospice Board of St. Luke's Hospital. David and Julie are founding members of the Ronald McDonald House in Cedar Rapids.

FOUNDER'S DAY 2008


