Brother Keeps in Touch From Afar

Spotlight on John A. Carey '71

John A. Carey '71 vividly recalls the summer of 1970 when he became a pledge member of Phi Kappa Psi after Sam Harris '66, Walter Williams '67, and others convinced him to begin his lifelong affiliation with the fraternity. Fred Clay '67, Guy Gunter '67, Larry Harper '69, Jay Masingill '68, and others quickly became his mentors and lifelong friends.

John has fond memories of band parties at the fraternity house, football games, social events at Lake Lurleen, get-togethers at Snow's Farm, and numerous Founders' Day events. He was unable to attend football games for 15 years (1992-2007) but has managed to attend all three recent national championship games in Pasadena (2010), New Orleans (2012), and Miami (2013). During the 2012 football season, he attended Crimson Tide games in Dallas, Baton Rouge, Tuscaloosa, and Miami. "After all of those years removed from Crimson Tide football, the recent games have made me feel like a college student again!" he said.



John received his undergraduate degree in political science in 1974 and his law degree from the University of Alabama in 1979. After law school, he held legal positions in Tuscaloosa, Jackson, Mississippi, and Mobile. He left his position as a partner at Johnstone, Adams, Bailey, Gordon and Harris in Mobile to move to Albuquerque, New Mexico, in 1989.

Since then, John has stayed in touch with the fraternity primarily through his long friendship with Jay Masingill. "Jay has kept me informed about the lives and careers of fraternity members as well as the various moves of the fraternity house. Jay and I were roommates when I was an undergraduate and we have remained close friends since then," he said.

From 1996 to 2008, John served as president and CEO of the Association of Commerce and Industry of New Mexico (ACI). ACI is the statewide business advocate and New Mexico affiliate of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce and the National Association of Manufacturers. ACI is comprised of businesses of all sizes throughout the state. During his tenure at ACI, John delivered hundreds of speeches and frequently appeared on radio and television.

In 2008, John took a position as president and CEO of the New Mexico Society of CPAs, a statewide professional association that advocates for the CPA profession on regulatory and legislative matters at the state and federal level.

John has served on numerous boards and commissions and has been a leader in many civic, philanthropic, educational, business, and community organizations. From 2004 to 2007, he served a three-year term as chairman of the National Industrial Council, comprised of 50 state business organizations like ACI, with 150,000 member businesses that employ over 30 million American workers. He was the first New Mexican to lead this organization in its 100-year history. In addition, John has served on the board of the New Mexico Finance Authority, AAA New Mexico, Irwin Union Bank, ACCION New Mexico-Arizona-Colorado (chairman, 2007-09), New Mexico Society of Association Executives (chairman, 2001-02), Educate New Mexico (chairman, 2010-12), Tourism Association of New Mexico, New Mexico Business Roundtable, and the City of Albuquerque Citizens Independent Salary Commission (chairman, 2010-present).

John has three children: Ryan (35), Melissa (32), and Stuart (25). He also has four grandchildren, ages 6, 4, 3, and 1. He looks forward to seeing his fraternity brothers at games this fall. John can be reached at jaccarey@comcast.net.

Recruitment Strategies
